Under this scheme college student from Pune city to visit in the village called vinzar where college is situated. Farmers from this area always face the scarcity of labour at the time of paddy transplantation. College students helped farmers directly in the process of transplantation of paddy sidling. This year 6800 students from the city area participated in the programme. Total 220 acres of area come under cultivation. The biggest advantage of this programme is that the area which remains idle due to non-availability of labor is now come under cultivation.
